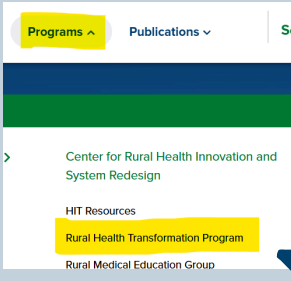


NRHA Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) Resources Guide

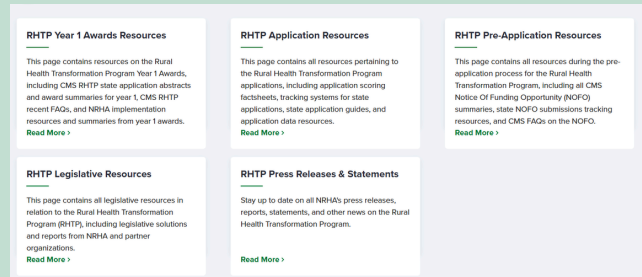
Step 1: Navigate to the RHTP webpage



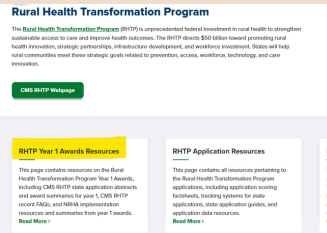
The RHTP Webpage is housed under NRHA's "Programs" tab in our "Center for Rural Health Innovation and System Redesign".

Each state is responsible for designing and releasing its own funding opportunities via Request for Proposals (RFPs) listed on this page. This interactive tracker gives you a real-time view of where every state stands in its RHTP procurement process, from early development through active awards. Use it to monitor open opportunities, track upcoming deadlines, and identify states where funding has already been awarded.

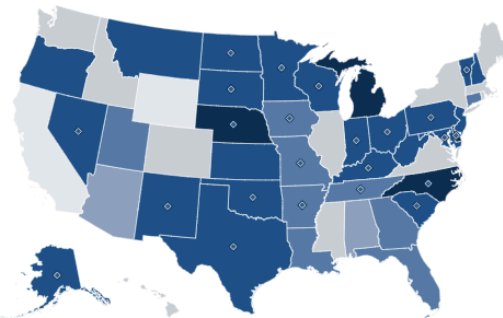

Navigating grant opportunities can be challenging. Please reference our guide on tips for grant writing and how to use the resources below to assist with applying to RFP funding opportunities.

Grant Writing Quick Tips

- Read and follow all application instructions carefully
- Make sure your project aligns with the funder's priorities
- Clearly explain the need for your project using data and evidence
- Create realistic goals, timelines, and clear cost categories for budgets
- Include community partners and stakeholder support when possible
- Double-check all required documents and attachments
- Submit early to avoid last-minute issues

Rural Health Information Hub Grant Writing Resource Guide

The RHlhub grant writing resource is designed to help organizations and communities learn about the grant writing process, identify funding opportunities, and develop competitive grant proposals for rural health projects.

Tips on using this resource

- Use the guide's planning and proposal development resources to learn how to assess community need, gather supporting data, and prepare a competitive application
- Review the project examples and model programs section to see how other rural organizations have successfully secured funding and implemented projects
- Access data, research, and rural health statistics that can strengthen needs assessments and support grant applications
- Utilize the sustainability resources to learn strategies for maintaining programs after grant funding ends

Center for Rural Health Grant Writing Toolkit Resource Guide

The University of North Dakota Center for Rural Health's Grant Writing Toolkit is designed to guide users through the process of developing a competitive grant proposal. The toolkit is organized into sections that correspond to the major components of a grant application.

- Use the "Elements of a Grant Proposal" section to learn about common proposal components, including needs statements, goals and objectives, project design, evaluation plans, budgets, and sustainability plans
- Review the grant writing tips section for guidance on preparing a strong proposal and avoiding common mistakes

Fundamentals of Rural Grant Writing Course

The Fundamentals of Rural Grant Writing course is Level I of the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health (NOSORH) Grant Writing Institute. The training is designed to introduce participants to the foundational elements of rural health grant development and proposal writing. The course is 90 minutes in length and is divided into three online modules: Introduction to the Grant Process, Turning Ideas into Fundable Projects, and Leveraging Rural Health Funding and Data.
