Dear valued members of the media,

Last November, the nation's leading health care organizations established the Rural Health Action Alliance (RHAA), representing providers and facilities that provide millions of Americans with high-quality, evidence-based care – particularly those living and working in rural and underserved areas.

On Friday, members of RHAA sent a <u>letter to congressional leadership</u> on priorities for the next COVID-19 relief package.

Among the top priorities are a 20 percent carveout of current and future Provider Relief Fund dollars; a 20 percent carveout of current and future Centers for Disease Control funding for vaccine deployment and COVID-19 testing, tracing, and mitigation programs; a continuation of Medicare sequestration relief; and a continuation of the important telehealth benefits afforded to rural providers through the CARES Act and 1135 wavier process.

RHAA looks forward to working with congressional leadership to advance legislation that will meet the needs of rural providers.
