Rural Health

The Federal Office of Rural Health Policy (FORHP) provides grant funding to improve health care for the approximately 63 million individuals who live in rural areas in the United States. This includes grant programs to increase rural access to health care, strengthen rural health networks, build capacity to train rural physicians, and encourage high-quality care at Critical Access Hospitals and other small rural hospitals.

FORHP grantees use evidence-based and promising practice models in their rural communities. These models focus on a range of rural health care issues, including the rural public health workforce, morbidity and mortality associated with substance use disorder, and access to maternal and obstetrics care in rural communities. FORHP grantees also work to build the rural health care evidence-base through research and information sharing. In addition, the office advises the Secretary of Health and Human Services on the potential effect of policies on rural health care.
